Committee A Chairman William Maxwell brought forward action that needs to be taken by the Full Commission from the Committee A Meetings.

Exemption of Churches from Solid Waste Fee

Committee A discussed the exemption of Churches from the Solid Waste Fee and agreed to exempt and take to the Full Commission for a vote. Chairman William Maxwell explained that the Committee had found out more information on this matter and deferred the topic to Commissioner David Chandler for discussion. David Chandler thinks the Commission needs to investigate more before totally exempting because of all non-profit organizations in the County. Joey Grissom thinks all churches need to be exempted period. David Chandler explained, "There is forty something Churches in Van Buren County and this would be around \$300.00 a month at a \$7.00 fee." Henry Seamons made a motion, second by Bill Mosley to send this back to the Committee for further discussion. All agreed by voice vote. Motion passed.

New Amortization Schedule from CTCB

The Amortization Schedule is the Breakdown of the loan payment of the New Administrative/Justice Facility for this year's payment. This needs to be broken down for Audit purpose. Forgive of inter-fund Loan (BDS)

The County made a enter fund loan when purchasing BDS. Money was taken from the General Fund put into Solid Waste General Debt Service. In order to not get another audit finding again this year this debt would need to be forgiven. William Maxwell stated, "It doesn't mean we won't go back and pay this back at a later date, it just needs to be cleared out to avoid an audit finding in the future." William Maxwell made a motion, second by David Chandler to proceed with it and forgive the debt.

Medical Insurance for Employee's

The Medical Insurance the County Currently has now as of 2019 is increasing at 12%. Mayor Wilson wanted to look at different options for the employee's. Larry Sprouse with Sprouse Insurance presented the Mayor with 3 options best suited for the County and employees:

Option 1	Present Coverage	39,201.00
Option 2	Gold 50	46,040.40
Option 3	Silver 67	37.947.00

Mayor Wilson explained to the Full Commission that the current plan will be going up 12% and the County pays ½ the Insurance for employee's and the employee pays the other ½. The option Gold 50 is much more expensive. The option 3 Silver 67 is better coverage with the

deductible being \$3,000.00 with out of pocket at \$5,500.00 and the current deductible is \$5,000.00 with \$6600.00 out of pocket. One thing that makes this plan a little better is that it's \$15.00 a month cheaper also as you can see the numbers that are presented are based upon the number of employees we currently have now enrolled into the program. That would bring it down to \$37,947.00 opposed to keeping the same plan we have now with an increase to \$43,881.00 for the County's part. Mayor Wilson recommends Option 3 Silver 67. William Maxwell made a motion, second by Mickey Robinson to except that plan as presented.

Attorney Michael Kress II for Long Branch Lakes at Fall Creek Falls Property Owners Association, Inc. had requested by Letter to address the Full Commission in relation to real property situated within the Long Branch Lakes at "Fall Creek Falls" community, which has been acquired by Van Buren County by virtue of the tax sale. The subject parcels are known within the Long Branch Lakes as the Bald Knob section. These parcels have accumulated a bunch of property taxes and maintenance fees. Attorney Michael Kress spoke with the County Attorney Howard Upchurch and the Full Commission with two proposed options. After much discussion on this matter, Chairman Joey Grissom would like for this to go to Committee A with the five Board Member from Long Branch Lakes POA and County Attorney Howard Upchurch present. Dear Mayor Wilson and Members of the Board:

This letter acknowledges receipt of a certified copy of the fiscal year 2019 budget.

We have reviewed the budget and have determined that projected revenues and other available funds are sufficient to meet anticipated expenditures. Our review of the budget is based solely on the information we have received and is for determining that the budget appears to be balanced. Regarding programs included in the budget such as education, roads, and corrections, we have not attempted to determine that the local government has complied with specific program statutes or guidelines, or with any financing requirements prescribed by any state or federal agency. A property tax rate may be included in this budget, and we would recommend that local government officials be certain that all program requirements have been met before initiating the tax collection process.

This letter constitutes approval, by this office, for the County's fiscal year 2019 budget as adopted by the County Commission.

Considerations Concerning the Budget

The Office of State and Local Finance has determined that the County's budget meets basic statutory requirements, but we have detected a challenge, outlined below, that could possibly lead to financial problems in the future.

General Purpose School Fund and Central Cafeteria Fund

As part of the annual budget submission process required by T.C.A. § 9-21-403, we review the projected ending cash balances for each of the County's funds. The projected ending cash balances for the County's General Purpose School Fund and Central Cafeteria Fund (the "Funds") are budgeted to equal less than one-month's average monthly spending at the end of fiscal year 2019. To ensure the Funds have sufficient cash during fiscal year 2019 to remain balanced the County's

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finance staff should provide the following information to the Commission, if it does not already do so:

- Updated cash flow analyses for the Funds showing actual data from the prior month and any changes to forecasted data, and
- budget-to-actual reports for the Funds including both revenue collections and expenditures.

Please submit these reports to the Commission at each regular meeting. We recommend that the County's finance staff provide the Commission these reports for all funds.

Please ensure that all funds remain balanced throughout the fiscal year and amend the budget prior to needing additional spending authority.
